Context and Methodology


- In collaboration with CDE, the Colorado Education Initiative (CEI) administered the district and charter needs inventory from late March to early April.
- Superintendents, BOCES directors and charter and facility school leaders were encouraged to complete the needs inventory
- CEI staff provided data management, analysis, reporting and follow-up support for the needs inventory efforts.
- Data summarized in this report reflect results for charter schools as well as how charter responses compared to district responses

Charter Respondents

- As of April 15th, there have been a total of 370 respondents to the needs inventory, with 184 of those representing districts or BOCES and 186 representing charter or facility schools. Of the 186 charter schools, some responses reflected multi-site networks, so overall charter representation was higher.
- After conducting individual outreach, the needs of 250 charter schools were captured, leaving only 10 schools out of this data set.


Educational Supports Needed Across Colorado Charters




Educational Supports Charter vs. District Top Needs



- 5- Technical supports for delivering remote learning


Prepared to Support Student Subgroups in Charter Schools



Prepared to Support Student Subgroups: Charter vs. District





Prepared to Support Student Subgroups: Single Site Charters vs. Multiple Schools








